REMINDER OF THE OVERALL PURPOSE OF THE NETWORK AND ITS PROPOSED OUTCOMES

The primary aim of EUSW Thematic Network is to encourage a comparative approach to Social Work. With the involvement of academic and professional bodies across Europe, this network aims at establishing a shared knowledge base in relation to Social Work education, practice and evaluation through:

- a consideration of the transferability of social work knowledge across European national boundaries;
- an analysis of Social Work education and practice in relation to values, theories, knowledge and skills;
- the establishment of a data bank providing information on Social Work training, practice and evaluation in all European Countries;
- promoting a comparative approach to Social Work education

For this project to progress well and successfully achieve its outcomes there must be a direct and complete commitment fromy each participating institution. The first annual meeting, which will take place at the beginning of the first year, will help to identify the specific working groups in charge of implementing each output. Under the direction

of one of the institutions on the Project's Board, the different working groups will operate in order to achieve specific outcomes. Additionally, systems will be instituted so that all the working groups will interact with each other in order to facilitate a constant exchange of information.
