- Each participating country will provide an interactive workshop about practice learning from staff, practitioners and students.

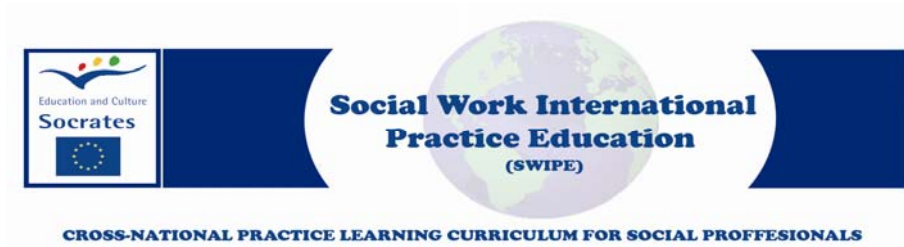
The conference is for everyone involved in social work practice education, practice educators, university tutors, service users, and training officers.
